

TAP/NYS DREAM ACT APPLICATION CHECKLIST

Follow these steps to fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or the NYS Dream Act Application, and the NYS Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) each year to apply for most types of financial aid.

Determine if you are an independent or dependent student

Independent: only report information about yourself and not your parent(s) **Dependent:** report information about yourself and your parent(s) — most common

You are an **independent** student in New York if any of the following are true about you:

- · If you are 35 years of age or older, you are automatically considered independent
- **If If you are 22 to 34 years of age**, you must establish financial independence by meeting the following criteria in 2024 and 2025:
 - · Will not live in your parents' home or a building owned or leased by your parents even if you paid rent
 - · Will not be listed as a dependent of your parent on the federal or NY State tax returns, AND
 - · Will not receive more than \$750 in financial assistance (loans, gifts, etc.) from either or both parents
- If you are under 22 years of age as of June 30, 2024, you must establish financial independence AND one of the following special conditions*:
 - Your parents are deceased or are totally and permanently disabled or have been declared incompetent by a court
 - · You are a ward of the court
 - You are receiving public assistance under your own name**, OR
 - You are financially independent due to a special circumstance that prevents you from providing parental information
- *You do not have to meet the special conditions if he/she:
 - · Was married on or before December 31, 2024
 - · Is enrolled as a graduate student in the 2024-2025 academic year
 - · Received TAP as an independent student in the prior award year
 - ** This does not include food stamps or unemployment insurance

- Your parent's marital status has changed since 2023
- You have concerns about your or your parents' citizenship status
